CHILD SUPPORT ENFORCEMENT (CSE)

Child Support Enforcement provides services in locating the non-custodial parent, establishing legal fatherhood (paternity), establishing the financial obligation of the non-custodial parent, establishing Medical support, enforcing medical and support orders. Parents who need assistance in obtaining services can apply at the nearest Child Support Enforcement office. Parents who apply for cash assistance also apply for Child Support Enforcement services at the time of application and receive services at time of approval.

CHILD CARE ADMINISTRATION (CCA)

Child Care specialists interview applicants to determine eligibility for state or federally subsidized childcare. When eligibility is determined, authorizations are made per parental choice of certified home, licensed group homes and centers, or non-certified relative provider homes.

Upon meeting eligibility requirements, services are available to parents who are employed or in job training; parents who are emotionally, mentally or physically unable to provide child care full time; recipients of Supplementary Security Income who are working or families receiving TANF (Temporary Assistance to Needy Families) and are involved in work-related activities.

CHILD CARE ADMINISTRATION (CCA) - Continued

Services are also available to Child Protective Services clients, foster children, and individuals whose incomes are at or below the 165th percentile of the federal poverty level. Applications may be submitted without an appointment at any Child Care office location. Child Care specialists certify family childcare homes, which provide care for no more that 4 children at any one time for compensation. Child Care providers must provide a healthy, safe environment for children, in addition to meeting state requirements and policies.

DIVISION OF DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES (DDD)

The Division of Developmental Disabilities within DES provides services and programs to children (0-5) who are at-risk of a developmental disability and individuals (6 and over) who are diagnosed with mental retardation, autism, cerebral palsy or epilepsy. The Division believes individuals can be served in integrated community settings. Thus, the majority of programs and services are tailored to meet individual needs at home or in community based settings.

EMPLOYMENT SECURITY ADMINISTRATION (ESA)

Job Service: Job service is a network of public employment offices providing placement services to job seekers and labor force recruitment services to employers. Staff reviews the skills and experience of applicants and match them to available job openings. If no suitable opening exists, employers may be contacted in an effort to develop jobs for an applicant. Staff also provides a Job Bank for employers where they can list job openings. Job Service staff then screen applicants to assure they meet basic job requirements before referring them to an interview.

FOOD STAMPS

DES determines eligibility for food stamps to enable eligible families to supplement their food budget. Eligibility is based on household size, income and resources. Each able-bodied adult must be registered for employment at Job Service. Nutrition education also is available. Itinerant services are available to seven rural communities and over 50 authorized group-living arrangements. It is also available to elderly and disabled persons on an on-call basis. Benefits are awarded using a debit card called "EBT" (Electronic Benefit Transfer).

FOOD STAMP EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING (FSE & T)

The FSE & T program is an employment program for food stamp recipients. Like the JOBS Program, FSE & T stresses obtaining employment at the earliest opportunity. Food stamp recipients may receive services from the FSE & T Program for a maximum of 6 months in a 12-month period. The Division of Benefits and Medical Eligibility refer participants to the FSE & T program. The FSE & T program offers:

- Employment service including job readiness workshops, structured job search activities, and job development and placement.
- Paid Work Experience to enhance skills, establish a current work history, and gain confidence and/or to develop good work habits.
- GED and/or Short Term Training that can be completed within the allowable time frames can be provided for those clients that have been unsuccessful in their job search activities.
- Supportive Services such as work appropriate clothing, tools and equipment, licenses and counseling.

FOSTER CARE (FC)

DES recruits, trains and licenses foster parents to care for foster children (infants to eighteen years of age). Foster parents may be single or married adults at least 21 years of age. Financial reimbursement and medical and dental coverage are provided for foster children by the State. Contact your local CPS office for foster parenting applications and orientation procedures.

JOB OPPORTUNITIES AND BASIC SKILLS TRAINING PROGRAM (JOBS)

The DES JOBS Program is an employment and training program that offers comprehensive services to individuals receiving Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF). The mission of the JOBS program is to transition public assistance recipients to employment that will lead to economic independence. The JOBS Program is a case management model delivery system that provides an array of comprehensive services to cash assistance recipients through a contract provider network. Services available through this network include employment, basic education, vocational and skills training, childcare, support and post employment/training and transitional services to recipients or former recipients. For more than 60 years, the unemployment insurance program has provided a measure of economic security to the individual worker and the community in the event the workers become unemployed through no fault of their own. Unemployment Insurance benefits are paid to individuals who have filed a claim, are unemployed due to lack of work and are actively seeking, willing and able to accept immediate re-employment. The Unemployment Insurance program works closely with Job Service to assist clients in finding new employment. A new claim for unemployment insurance must be filed in person. The hours of operation are 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., Monday - Friday. Other services also available are: Shared work, Approved Training, and Trade Readjustment Assistance.

How do I Get Help? (For Behavioral Health Services)

The Community Partnership of Southern Arizona (CPSA) ensures the provision of accessible, high-quality, cost-effective behavioral health services to the people of Southern Arizona.

What is CPSA?

CPSA is the Regional Behavioral Health Authority (RBHA) designated by the State of Arizona to coordinate and manage publicly funded behavioral health services in Cochise, Graham, Greenlee, Pima and Santa Cruz counties.

What is SEABHS?

SEABHS provides, the delivery of routine and crisis mental health and substance abuse treatment services for children and adults living in Cochise, Graham, Greenlee and Santa Cruz counties.

Once a person is enrolled with SEABHS, we will set up a treatment plan will be set up to meet the care of the individual.

SEABHS staff are also available to work with individuals to establish eligibility for public medical assistance such as AHCCCS or KidsCare. SEABHS will also coordinate private insurance benefits and co-payment arrangements.

Anyone who may need behavioral health services for a mental health or substance abuse problem, or who may know someone who does, may call SEABHS any SEABHS location in your area.

SEABHS can help people in the following areas:

Child & Adolescent Services

- Serious conduct problems at home or school
- Alcohol or drug use
- Depression, anger or other signs of mental illness

Adult Mental Health Services

- Depression
- Anxiety
- Psychotic disorders
- Other mental illness

Adult Substance Abuse Services

- Alcohol or drug use
- Arrests for DUI or other drug-related charges
- Unsuccessful attempts to stop using substances
- Intravenous drug use
- Substance abuse during pregnancy

Prevention and Early Intervention

- Parenting and life skills
- Conflict resolution
- Self-esteem building
- Community building

Eligibility for Services

Persons in need of behavioral health services who are enrolled in Medicaid (Title XIX) or in KidsCare (Title XXI) or who are Seriously Mentally Ill (SMI) are eligible for services through CPSA. Other persons may be eligible for services funded with state money (subject to available funding) and/or may be asked to contribute a co-pay amount. Eligibility for services and the co-payment amount are determined through financial screening.

Getting Help:

Entering the System

There are three ways for a person seeking services to enter the behavioral health system:

- Be referred by a Primary Care Physician or a state agency
- Be referred by Crisis Services
- Call to make an appointment

After an initial contact has been made, an appointment will be scheduled so that basic clinical information may be obtained. The clinical assessment includes past history of problems and determination of a preliminary diagnosis and initial treatment plan.

Financial Screening

Some individual may be eligible to receive public assistance such as health care, food stamps, or social security. At the time of intake, and periodically thereafter, all clients are interviewed to identify whether they meet the eligibility criteria for these programs. At the time of the intake meeting, an individual will need:

- A copy of an AHCCCS or health plan card, if applicable.
- A copy of a Social security card or number, if available.
- Copies of pay stubs and unpaid medical bills.
- Information about other health insurance coverage.

Receiving Services

Once it is determined that a person is eligible, services will begin within 14 days from the date of evaluation.

A sign or foreign language interpreter will be provided, if necessary.

Crisis or Emergency Services

An individual believed to be experiencing a life-threatening crisis situation should dial 911.
